2 being evaluated, and how the rights and privileges  
3 afforded under such agreements may differ from  
4 United States law; and

5 (2) brief the Committee on Armed Services and  
6 the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of  
7 Representatives and the Committee on Armed Serv-  
8 ices and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the  
9 Senate on the findings of the review.

10 (b) TRAINING REQUIRED.—The Secretary of Defense  
11 shall review and improve as necessary training and edu-  
12 cational materials for members of the Armed Forces, their  
13 spouses, and dependents, as appropriate, who are sta-  
14 tioned in a country reviewed pursuant to subsection (a)(1)  
15 regarding relevant foreign laws, how such foreign laws  
16 may differ from the laws of the United States, and the  
17 rights of accused in common scenarios under such foreign  
18 laws.

19 (c) TRANSLATION STANDARDS AND READINESS.—  
20 The Secretary of Defense, in coordination with the Sec-  
21 retary of State, shall review foreign language standards  
22 for servicemembers and employees of the Department of  
23 Defense and Department of State who are responsible for  
24 providing foreign language translation services in situa-  
25 tions involving foreign law enforcement where a service-

1 member may be being detained, to ensure such persons  
2 maintain an appropriate proficiency in the legal termi-  
3 nology and meaning of essential terms in a relevant lan-  
4 guage.
